



SOUTHERN MISSISSIPPI FEDERAL CREDIT UNION'S SCOTT INDUCTED INTO HALL OF FAME

Biloxi, Miss. (5/17/18) - - Southern Mississippi Federal Credit Union Director Raymond Scott has been inducted into the Mississippi Credit Union Hall of Fame. Created in 1993, the Mississippi Credit Union Hall of Fame is the state's highest credit union honor, recognizing individuals that have devoted their life to the philosophy and success of credit unions at the local, state or national level.

Raymond Scott's service with Southern Mississippi Federal Credit Union started in 1978 when he began working on a software program to automate the records of the credit union, allowing the credit union to move from manual records to computer processing. After the project, Ray's service to the credit union continued with him serving on the loan committee, supervisory committee, and the board of directors, where he currently serves as chairman.

Ray was also elected to the Mississippi Credit Union Association Board of Directors in 2006 and currently serves as treasurer.

Southern Mississippi Federal Credit Union CEO John Harmond described Scott as a hands-on leader, saying "Ray has done everything, including numerous data processing conversions, overseeing the purchase or renovation of new locations, field-of-membership expansions, mergers, and exploring and implementing new products and services. He even personally went to Florida and obtained generators and fuel to help the credit union re-open for business after Hurricane Katrina. Ray is a great volunteer."
